What is the West Traverse Mountain Compatibility Area Study?

A **collaborative effort** among the local project sponsor — Mountainland Association of Governments — and Utah and Salt Lake Counties; the Cities of Bluffdale, Eagle Mountain, Herriman, Lehi, and Saratoga Springs; the Town of Cedar Fort; Camp Williams; state and federal agencies; the public; and other affected stakeholders.

- An **update** to the 2012 Camp Williams Joint Land Use Study
- A **community-led** project to identify compatibility issues
- A **body of information** that assists with making more **informed decisions**
- A study that **recommends tailored actions** to promote compatibility

- Maintain **quality of life**

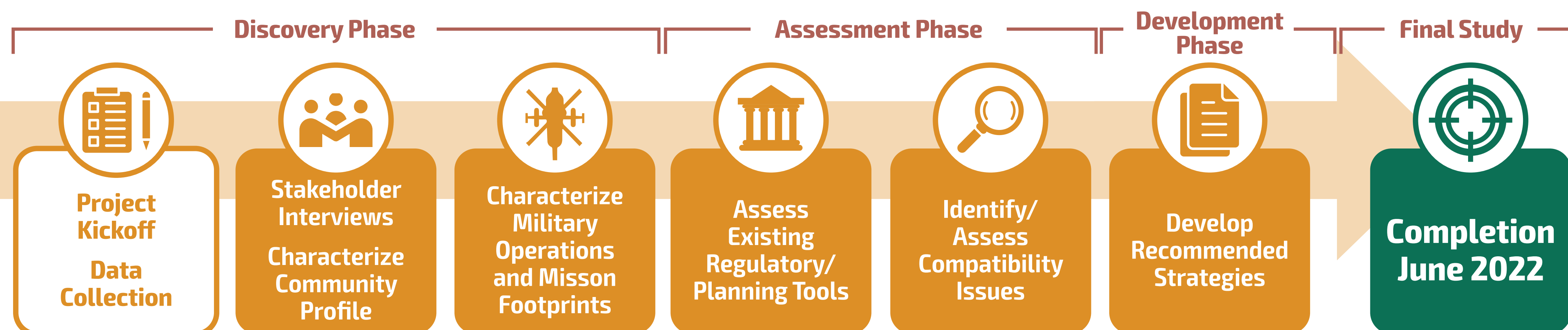
COMMUNITY BENEFITS

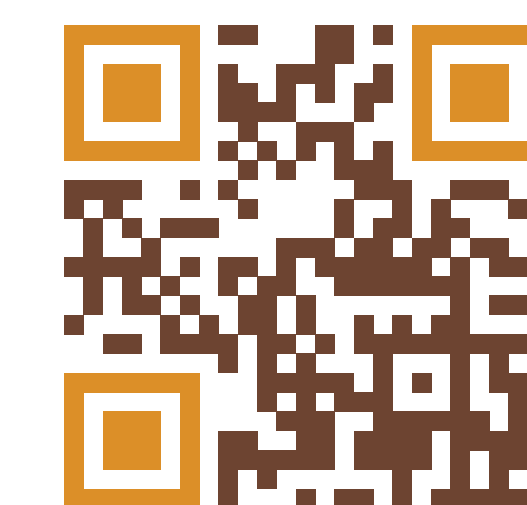

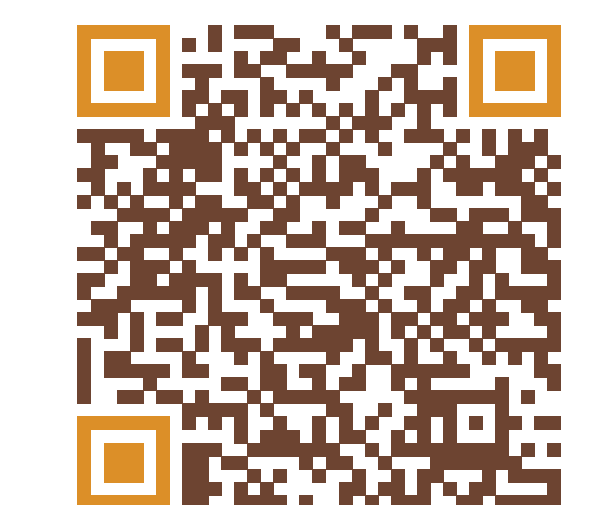
